A Message from the Executive Director

On behalf of the Board of Directors, staff, and our volunteers, I am proud to share Safe Space NOVA's Annual report, which highlights our work and achievements over the past year.

As the Founder and Executive
Director of Safe Space NOVA I am very
appreciative of the work we have been able
to accomplish, especially in such a turbulent
time. As you know, the United States and the
world at large were exposed to the
CoronaVirus, which quickly became a
pandemic and caused concern about



transmission rates from human contact. The impact of the pandemic is still present today. To ensure the safety of our staff, volunteers, and youth, Safe Space NOVA halted all in-person events within the first quarter of the year.

To assure youth that Safe Space NOVA would remain a beacon of light that they could turn to, monthly virtual meetings were established and they remained in place for the remainder of FY 2020. Some of the activities offered during the virtual sessions included virtual bingo, a virtual escape room and a virtual drag makeup tutorial to name a few. We also expanded our local partnerships with organizations such as the Casa BruMar Foundation and were recognized by Reston Pride with the Best LGBTQI+ Community Organization/Nonprofit Award.

From a fundraising standpoint we continued to receive donations from individuals and companies in the community including the Kearney & Company and Manumission Tours. Lastly, we continued our advocacy efforts by participating in Town Hall events in both Fairfax and Loudoun County, sat on panels discussing the state of mental health for LGBTQ+ Youth in Northern Virginia and met with the Virginia Governor's Director of LGBTQ+ Outreach.

For our LGBTQ+ and allied youth that we work with, the world is constantly changing and the struggles for safety are real. As an organization, we commit to being engaged and responsive in addressing the needs of LGBTQ+ youth, particularly the voices that are often silenced or unheard.

Went Virtual

Expanded our Social Media Presence

This year we started a few different social media projects in order to engage more frequently with our community. During the first part of the year, we ran a social media quiz where participants had to answer quiz questions based off of things we had posted on instagram. Their prize was a swag package that included a Safe Space NOVA sweatshirt, wristbands, and more. Additionally, this year we hosted

Built New Connections

We were honored to be able to build new partnerships in the DMV area this year. Working with Casa BruMar Foundation and their Virtual Fundraiser in September was a great opportunity to connect with our community members. We also partnered with places such as the Torpedo Factory to host a Queer Valentines Event and we participated in Kids Fashion Week DMV in August.



Attended Community Events to Spread the Word

This year we were honored to be invited to events to promote the mission of Safe Space NoVa and spread awareness about mental health in the LGBTQ+ community. We attended gatherings such as the Fairfax County School board meeting, the LGBTQ+ town hall with Equality Loudoun, and even spoke on the "How Come They Didn't Teach Me That in School?" Podcast. We are grateful for the opportunity



to discuss mental health challenges amongst LGBT youth and provide local organizations and government structures the tools to help those in our community.




